# "The Little Things"

Over the past year we have heard Fr. Dominic preach about "The Little Things". He generally spoke about the things we do for our Parish. Such as Lawn care, snow removal, salting our walkways, Seasonal Decorating, Choir, Servers, Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, various Committees, Knights of Columbus and Women of Grace. He also spoke about Family, giving examples of his own family and our Parish family (Bleenie sales, Parish Block Party, Pie Sales and other activities). Yes, we are a family! A very faithful and good family! He said he feels blessed by our welcoming him and supporting him and we in turn are blessed to have him as our Pastor.

But do the little things we do in our daily lives, with our families, friends, coworkers, and so on have any effect on our world? Are little things really impactful when we are faced with such "Big Things" like COVID, abortion, secularism, a divided nation, not to mention the "Crisis" in our Church?

St Theresa's "The Little Way" is about being both small and doing the smallest action with great love. She taught that instead of focusing on large actions, we should bring God into our smallest actions.

Another Nun, who also became a Saint, Mother Teresa of Calcutta, lived a life that exemplified love, even *in the littlest things*. In doing little things and seeing Christ in the poor and dying she filled the world that much more with the radiant fragrance of God.

The little things matter in God's eyes. Remember the widow (Mark 12:41-44, Luke 21:1-4), who quietly gave out of her need, unlike the rich and powerful who sought the attention of men rather than God?

The Scriptures are full of example of God lifting the lowly and the little! Our Blessed Mother called herself a "lowly servant" and said that God will "lift up the lowly" (The Magnificat).

The little things like a good morning greeting, doing chores around the house, saying Grace before meals and prayer before bedtime with your kids, are all little things! Saying a prayer when you see an ambulance rushing somewhere or a Police Car or a Fire Truck; saying a prayer when passing by an accident scene or just to thank God for anything.

There are as many examples of "Little Things", as there are people performing the actions! Making the Sign of The Cross is the most common of all actions that Catholics do and yet in doing it we profess the deepest mysteries of the Christian Faith, the Trinity and the Cross, our Salvation! These are all little things that have eternal merit when done with love, specifically the love of Christ!


