Why is it wise to receive Holy Communion often, even daily?

The theme of today's Gospel is exclusively the Eucharist. Absolutely central to what we believe about the Eucharist is that Christ is really and truly present there. "For my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink." (Jn. 6:51).

Persecuted by the impious Queen Jezebel, the prophet Elijah fled into the desert and walked for a whole day without resting. Weary and disheartened, he finally threw himself down at the foot of a juniper tree and asked the Lord to let him die. But twice God sent an angel to bring him food and drink, and finally strengthened by that food, the prophet walked for forty days and forty nights until he reached the Mount of God, Horeb.

The miraculous bread which gave Elijah renewed courage and vigor was a type, a foreshadowing, of the Holy Eucharist, the true Bread of angels, by reason of which we are able to cross the wearisome desert of life with light hearts until we are admitted to the beatific vision of God in heaven.

If a person is free from mortal sin, he/she can and should receive our Lord as often as possible. Just as we nourish our bodies each day with bread, we should also nourish our souls with the Holy Eucharist that we may be able to lead holy lives.

Christ did not intend the Eucharist to be a reward of virtue; He did not institute it for angels. He instituted it for us.

So it is well to receive Holy Communion often, even daily. This intimate union with Jesus Christ, the source of all holiness and the Giver of all graces, is the greatest aid to a holy life.

"Holy Communion is the shortest and the safest way to Heaven." St. Pius X.
