### Gospel (Mk10:17-30)

The Gospel consists of a story of a good young man who refuses to follow Christ because he is unwilling to part with his wealth so he went away sad.

The Jews believed that the prosperity of the rich was a sign of God's blessing. But Jesus presents wealth as a stumbling block to the Kingdom. Love of material possessions and comforts is one of the chief obstacles in the way of discipleship. Salvation is always God's achievement.

It's very hard for us to give away our wealth because it means depriving ourselves of the resource on which we have come to rely for status, security, and enjoyment of life.

The essence of Christian faith is to put one's trust in God and to rely on God as the sole source of security and well-being.

The young man stood on the brink of a new and exciting world. However, he realized at once that he could not enter this new world without saying goodbye to his old world. He hesitated. He thought about it. He looked back at that old world to weigh up the things he was leaving. Suddenly he realized he couldn't do it. There was too much in that old world which he loved and wanted. So he refused the invitation of Jesus.

The thing we might be called upon to sacrifice in order to take up that challenge could vary for each of us. We have to look into our hearts to see what it is that we would have to give up in order to respond to it.
