"Jesus, son of David, have mercy on me"

In today's Gospel (Mk10:46-52) Jesus hears the cry of a blind man and gives him back his sight. His meeting with Jesus gave Bartimaeus the gift of spiritual as well physical sight, and the former blind beggar became a disciple of Jesus.

Today we have invented all kinds of devices to improve our seeing. We have ordinary glasses, bifocals, magnifying glasses, telescopes, microscopes. We can see more and farther than ever before in our history. Indeed, the miracle Jesus performed for Bartimaeus happens regularly in our hospitals.

Bartimaeus was in darkness until he met Jesus. We are in darkness when we doubt, when we live in error and prejudice, when we choose evil. Anger, hatred, jealousy, evil habits, addiction etc. make us spiritually blind and they prevent us from seeing the goodness and presence of God in our family members and neighbors. Sometimes our fears and habitual sins prevent us from approaching God in prayer.

Bartimaeus who was physically blind had more faith in Jesus than many of his disciples who had perfect eyesight. Whereas he has no doubt, they are full of doubt and hesitation. We can see a man who amidst his own aches and pains, finds his true happiness thanks to Jesus Christ.

Here on earth, though we have a sense of God, we do not see God Himself. We have to be content to travel by the light of faith towards that land where we shall see as we are seen.

"We can never have too much hope in God. He gives in the measure we ask" (Therese of Lisieux 1873-97)
