Christ the King of the Universe

On this great feast we rejoice in calling Christ our King. Jesus declares before Pilate that He is indeed a King but that His kingdom is not like the Kingdom of this world.

When we look at Jesus what do we see? There is no throne, no crown, no army. We see Him walking the dusty roads of Palestine with a little band of disciples. He is surrounded by the poor and the sick, by sinners and outcasts.

There is a great person who makes everybody feel small. But the really great person makes everybody feel great. In fact, Jesus was indeed a King. His presence could change beyond recognition the lives of those around Him. His attitude towards sinners was one of kindness and persuasion rather than condemnation. Pilate had power over people; Jesus had influence on them. Jesus made His presence felt simply by the kind of person He was.


