The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick Part 2: Continued

Now let's look at some of the basic facts about the sacrament itself. The sacrament is regarded as the normal ministry given to the sick. We should ask for anointing in times of serious illness, when greatly weakened by advanced age, or when there is any danger of death. The sacrament may also be administered to children who have sufficient use of reason to be comforted by the sacrament. The sacrament is not administered to the dead. However, it will be administered conditionally if there is any doubt. The sacrament may be administered repeatedly if a new illness occurs or there is a relapse in a continuing illness. If possible the person to be anointed should ask for the sacrament personally and prepare for it by prayer, and if needed, and/or desired, by the reception of the sacrament of Penance.

Christ never fails to act when the Church administers a sacrament but the effectiveness of the sacrament depends on our response. That's why our preparation is so important. The Anointing of the Sick is not magic; we should prepare for this sacrament with prayer and reflection and come to it with faith and the expectation of receiving God's help.

The essence of the sacrament - what makes the sacrament an effective act of Jesus ministering to the needs of his people - consists of the anointing with oil by a priest and the prayer.

"Through this holy anointing may the Lord in His love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit. Amen. May the Lord who free you from sin, save you and raiseyou up. Amen"

The usual site of anointing is the forehead and hands. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick focuses God's power and presence in our lives and offers us the strength that we need to bring us through the time of crisis. The effects of the sacrament are: to give us confidence in God's Divine Mercy, to give us courage to resist temptation, to give us patience to bear our sufferings, to fill us with the desire for God's will, and sometimes to restore bodily health - if it would be of advantage to the salvation of soul. The purpose of the sacrament is to heal the whole person by giving him/her an effective way to cope with his/her sickness.

If the person is dying, the anointing may be followed by **Viaticum** - Holy Communion for the dying and the Papal blessing.
