### The Holy Eucharist

The Holy Eucharist is a sacrament and a sacrifice. In It our Lord Jesus Christ, body and blood, soul and divinity, under the appearances of blood and wine, is contained, offered and received.

Christ instituted the Holy Eucharist at the Last Supper on the night before He died. First, He took bread, blessed and broke it and giving it to His Apostles said "Take and eat, this is my body." Then He took a cup of wine, blessed it and giving it to them said:

"All of you drink of this; for this is

My blood of the new covenant which is being shed for many for the forgiveness of sins."

Finally, Jesus said to His Apostles: "Do this in remembrance of Me." When our Lord said, "This is My body," the entire substance of the bread was changed into His body. When He said, "This is My blood," the entire substance of the wine was changed into blood. Jesus Christ is whole and entire both under the appearances of bread and wine.

The change of bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ continues to be made in the Church by Jesus Christ, through the ministry of His priests. Priests use their sacramental power to change bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ at the consecration of the Mass
