Christ the King

The rulers sneered at Jesus and said, "He saved others, let him save himself if He is the chosen one, the Christ of God." (Luke 23:35) Of all the titles we could bestow on Jesus that of "King" would seem to be the most inappropriate. It smacks of the kind of things He rejected. When we think of a King, we think of a throne, a crown, great wealth, power, and a retinue of servants, and, of course an army.

When we look at Jesus what do we see? There is no throne, no crown, no palace, no army. We see Him walking the dusty road of Palestine with a little band of disciples. He is surrounded by the poor and the sick, by sinners and outcasts.

Some of the people with the greatest moral authority are quite powerless, and the most influential have no need to control those they influence.

There is often a great person who makes everyone feel small, but the really great person makes everyone feel great. In that sense, Jesus was indeed the King!

His presence could change beyond recognition the lives of those around Him. His attitude toward sinners was one of kindness and persuasion rather than condemnation.

"For in Him all the fullness was pleased to dwell, and through Him to reconcile all things for Him, making peace by the blood of His cross through Him, whether those on earth or those in heaven."
